

#### **MINUTES**

A meeting of the Senate of the University of Victoria was held on January 6, 2012 at 3:30 p.m. in the Senate and Board Chambers, University Centre, Room A180.

#### 1. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

# 3. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

Dr. Turpin reported that the review of the appointment procedures for the Associate Deans would begin in 2012, either in the spring or fall.

#### 4. REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR

## a. President's Report

Dr. Turpin reported that there were four new convocation senators who were recently elected by the Convocation. All four were in attendance and Dr. Turpin welcomed and introduced them. Nav Bassi, Linda Hannah, Robbyn Lanning and Cathy McIntyre. Dr. Turpin also welcomed and introduced the new University Librarian, Jonathan Bengston and provided senators with a brief description of his background. Finally, Dr. Turpin introduced Mr. Bill Trott from the Office of the University Secretary who will be Acting Associate University Secretary while Ms. Carrie Andersen is on a five month leave.

With respect to federal matters, Dr. Turpin reported that universities were continuing to stress the importance of adequate research funding and noted the economic situation was not much better.

With respect to provincial matters, Dr. Turpin reported that the university was being cautiously optimistic that grant funding would remain stable. He noted the university would probably need to achieve a 1.5% budget reduction in 2012/13. He said there were a number of uncertainties that

needed to be resolved, noting that the 2% tuition increase would be going ahead for next year. He said he anticipated a couple of fiscally tough years ahead.

With respect to matters at the university, Dr. Turpin reported the following:

- The Welcome Centre, located on the first floor of the University Centre, opened its doors on January 3<sup>rd</sup>. The centre provides a first point of contact for new students, visitors, alumni and current members of the campus community in navigating the university;
- UVic ranked 200<sup>th</sup> in the international Leiden ranking, ahead of many Canadian universities with medical schools. The ranking aims to provide highly accurate measurements of the scientific impact of universities and of universities' involvement in scientific collaboration. The ranking is based on over 25 years of bibliometric experience at the Centre for Science and Technology Studies of Leiden University in The Netherlands. The Leiden Ranking does not use reputational surveys or data provided by the institutions;
- Large Hadron Collider on December 13, 2011 researchers released results that offered indications that the elusive Higgs boson or "God particle" actually exists and that a long-standing theory of physics may well be true, which could help explain how matter was formed at the dawn of the universe. The UVic-ATLAS team was responsible for designing and building several crucial components of one of two large detectors recording debris from the subatomic collisions in CERN's 27-km circular collider buried 100 metres underground near Geneva. UVic physics and astronomy adjunct professor and Institute for Particle Physics scientist Dr. Rob McPherson is also the spokesperson for ATLAS Canada;
- CANARIE, a high speed data network, recently ranked UVic as #2 in data traffic, just slightly behind the University of Toronto;
- A new partnership between the RCMP, youth organizations and UVic researchers will train RCMP youth officers to assist schools and rural communities in delivering the WITS (Walk away, Ignore, Talk it out and Seek help) anti-bullying program in places it has not been offered before. The WITS Program was developed through a UVic-community partnership.

Dr. Turpin reported on a number of awards and honours received by members of the university community. Professor Heather Raven, Associate Dean of Law and a member of the Brokenhead Ojibway First Nation, was appointed Queen's Counsel in December. On December 10, 2011, Dr. Budd Hall received an Honorary Degree of Laws from St. Francis Xavier University.

# a. Planning and Priorities Committee

# i. Review and Renewal of the Strategic Plan

Dr. Turpin introduced a few members and resource persons of the Planning and Priorities Committee who were in attendance; Dr. Frank Van Veggel, Dr. Annalee Lepp, Dr. Geraldine Van Gyn, Dr. Reeta Tremblay, Mr. Bruce Kilpatrick and Ms. Ludgard De Decker.

For the benefit of new senators, Dr. Turpin provided background on the process that had taken place over the last few years, led by the Planning and Priorities Committee, to produce the renewed plan that was before Senate. He noted the changing financial environment and the major demographic changes. As a result, we would be building excellence rather than focusing on

growth. He said that there were a number of areas where there needed to be major emphasis, such as in improving systems and processes, and an emphasis on community and community engagement.

Dr. Littlewood referred to objective 12(c) and asked what specific ideas were being contemplated. Dr. Turpin said that the issue of the breadth requirement was a topic of discussion with a number of faculties during the consultation process. He advised that one of the Senate committees would be asked to undertake the task of looking at this issue.

# a. Senate Committee on Agenda and Governance

# i. Revised Rules to Govern Elections to the Board of Governors and the Senate

Dr. Turpin said there was a further amendment to the document distributed with the agenda that had come about after a discussion between the Office of the University Secretary and the student societies.

Dr. Eastman said that the Office of the University Secretary meets annually with representatives of the student societies regarding the student elections. At the meeting this year, it was noted it would be important to try to align the student Board of Governors and Senate elections with the student society elections. Dr. Eastman said that, after consultation with the Senate Committee on Agenda and Governance, it was proposed to amend sections 9.2 and 11.1 of the document attached to the Senate agenda in order to permit continued alignment of the practises for the student elections. A sheet showing the proposed amendments had been distributed.

Dr. Devor asked about those areas in the rules that referenced paper ballots and if electronic methods could be used in place of paper. Dr. Eastman said that most elections have moved to an electronic method, including the use of webvote, and there were very few elections that still required paper ballots.

Dr. Haskett asked for clarification on section 3.3, student eligibility, specifically the May to July term. He pointed out that UVic in fact has seven terms rather than three. Dr. Eastman offered to amend that section to make it clearer. This was agreed. Ms. Manuel asked whether the Office of the University Secretary would send out an email to remind students to vote. Dr. Eastman confirmed there would be one email to students inviting nominations and another inviting them to vote.

# i. Proposal for a Bachelor of Engineering in Biomedical Engineering

A start date will be determined after consultation with the Registrar. Once Senate and the Board of Governors have approved the proposal, the proposal must be posted on the Ministry of Advanced Education website for peer review for a period of 30 days.
